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STATUTES & ORDINANCES PERTAINING TO ACADEMICS EXAMINATIONS

As an affiliated institution, S. Chandra Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Amgaon enforces academic governance and examination evaluations strictly in accordance with the regulatory acts of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016, and the official executive directives published by Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University (RTMNU).

1. NEP 2020 Implementation & Credit Framework

- **University Guidelines:** The college operates its undergraduate courses under RTMNU Direction No. 31 of 2024 (and subsequent updates), which outlines standard rules for admission, passing standards, and credit accumulation for the 4-year undergraduate programs.
- **The Academic Bank of Credits (ABC):** Under statutory UGC and state directives, all students must maintain an active National Academic Depository (NAD) ABC ID account. Academic credits earned from internal evaluation modules and end-of-semester university examinations are securely deposited digitally to facilitate flexible credit validation and regional student mobility.

2. Examination & Passing Rules

- **Attendance Threshold:** To qualify for seasonal university examination end-term sheets, students must systematically fulfill a statutory **minimum attendance benchmark of 75%** in both conceptual lectures and mandatory laboratory practical sessions.
- **Allowed to Keep Terms (ATKT) Regulations:** The progression of students to higher semesters is strictly guided by the official university ATKT ordinance clauses. Students can transition to progressive semesters provided they carry over a limited number of backlogs within university-prescribed ceilings.

- **Form of Assessment Structure:** Academic assessments split the grading metrics into two segments:
 - **Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE):** Apportioned directly by the college faculties through regular classroom unit examinations, home assignments, and dynamic field report evaluations.
 - **End-Semester Examinations (ESE):** Controlled and independently administered by RTMNU via centralized question papers and structural evaluations.

The core framework of the college

The core framework of the college is organized into functional Academic Departments and Administrative Advisory Committees designed to streamline localized operations.

1. Core Academic Departments

- **Department of Humanities & Social Sciences:** Coordinates structural Major and Minor courses for the Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) program. Students can select their primary specializations and supporting disciplines from a comprehensive range of fields, including Political Science, Sociology, History, Geography, Home Economics, Marathi, and English
- **Department of Home Sciences:** The Department of Home Sciences manages the comprehensive theoretical and laboratory-based curriculum for the B.Sc. Home Science program according to the **NEP 2020 4-Year Undergraduate Framework (FYUGP)** issued by RTMNU. This structured, multi-credit syllabus comprises **Discipline Specific Core (DSC/Major-Minor)** courses focusing on *Fundamentals of Food & Nutrition*, *Fundamentals of Human Development*, *Textile & Clothing*, *Family Resource Management*, and *Home Science Extension*. It also integrates a mandatory **Indian Knowledge System (IKS)** module titled *Indian Knowledge of Home Science - I*, foundational language tracks like *Compulsory English* under **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)**, and *Environmental Science* under **Value Education Courses (VEC)**.

Furthermore, the curriculum builds professional readiness through **Vocational (VSC)** and **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)** in *Catering Management, Fashion Illustration, Preschool Coordination, and Applied Digital Tools*.

2. Statutory, Operational, & Activity Centres

- **College Development Committee (CDC):** Formulated under the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016. The CDC outlines internal financial estimates, addresses structural employee/student welfare parameters, and shapes the college admission policy.
- **Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC):** Works on pedagogical oversight, planning internal academic calendars, framing faculty-wise time tables, and arranging value-added training interventions.
- **Academic Guidance & Career Cell:** Manages youth support programs and hosts career orientation seminars via local organizational MOUs.
- **Student Grievance & Welfare Cells:** Operates essential mandatory regulatory safety wings, including the *Anti-Ragging Committee*, the *Grievance Redressal Cell*, and dedicated *SC / ST / OBC and Minority Support Cells*.

Internal vs. External Marks Distribution (RTMNU NEP 2020)

Under the **Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University (RTMNU)** credit framework, your overall score in each course is split between continuous college testing and final university examinations.

A standard **4-credit course** (totalling 100 marks) uses the following distribution breakdown:

1. Theory-Based Courses (e.g., Political Science, Sociology, History, English, Marathi)

- **External Evaluation (End-Semester Exam - ESE): 80 Marks**
This is a centralized descriptive exam conducted by RTMNU at the end of the semester.

- **Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE): 20 Marks**

These marks are evaluated internally by your college professors throughout the semester and are calculated using:

- **Classroom Attendance & Conduct: 5 Marks**
- **Unit Tests / Mid-Term Exams: 5 Marks**
- **Home Assignments / Seminar Presentations: 5 Marks**
- **Active Field Projects / Group Discussions: 5 Marks**

2. Practical-Based Courses (e.g., Geography, Home Economics, B.Sc. Home Science Lab Modules)

- **External Theory Paper (ESE): 60 Marks**

Written university examination sheet.

- **External Practical Examination: 20 Marks**

Conducted at the college lab, assessed by an external university examiner via lab experiments and a viva-voce.

- **Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE): 20 Marks**

Internal submission of your practical journal, laboratory workbook maintenance, and day-to-day lab performance.

Admissions Under the Statutory Reservation Cell

S. Chandra Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Amgaon strictly follows the **Government of Maharashtra Verification and Seat Allocation Matrix** for backward classes. A dedicated **Reservation Cell** coordinates admissions to ensure equitable access.

1. Key Seat Distribution Rules

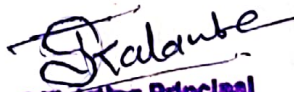
- **Caste Categories:** Specific seat percentages are legally reserved for **SC, ST, VJ/DT, NT-B, NT-C, NT-D, and OBC** candidates.

- **Economic & Social Quotas:** Includes mandated seat provisions for EWS (Economically Weaker Sections), alongside institutional relaxation quotas for daughters of defense personnel and physically handicapped candidates.

2. Step-by-Step Reservation Benefits & Validation

To claim a seat under the reservation quota and qualify for **MahaDBT Government Scholarships** (which can waive up to 100% of your tuition fees), you must submit these verified documents to the Reservation Cell during admission:

- **Caste Certificate:** Issued by a competent authority (Sub-Divisional Officer/Tahsildar) in Maharashtra.
- **Caste Validity Certificate:** Mandatory verification document confirming caste status.
- **Non-Creamy Layer (NCL) Certificate:** Required for OBC, VJ/DT, and NT categories to prove household income falls below the current legal ceiling.
- **Income Certificate:** Issued by the Tahsildar to verify economic status for EWS or scholarship fee-waiver eligibility.
